Comments

1. This is quite an important piece, as it bears evidence of almost certainly having been used in its present state. The long flake scar on the front face was left by a flake struck off from the blade end, which hung over what became the poll edge. Since the scar is well ground in, the blade must have been ground, a flint presumably used, with the butt so it now is. The long flake may have come off during use, in which case the cut would have originally been longer.
