


Comments 1. This is a superb piece. The flint has concentric patterning passing through it at two points, & fine veining throughout.
 2. Ear sides very flat & regular.
 3. On one side, the flaked poll end appears to have been produced after the cell became stained; on the other face, however this is less certain. Some of the scarring on the front face is in fact stained. Clearly at least 2 flaking phases, but these may have both been Neo/BA.
