Comments 1. Bagshaw S. 1851. History, Gazetteer + Directory of Shropshire etc. p.515: 'In a field not far from here [Netley Hall] were found four peculiarly hard stones, with a sharp axe-like edge all round; they are known by the name of celts, & were used by the priests to slay the victims of their sacrifices.' L.F.Chitty (1967 MS., Ludlow Museum) interprets this as a hoard, of which nos. 70018 + 70019 are 2 survivors.
Museum card: these 2 found in a drawer at Netley Hall before 1850. SAS MS-6, p.26
