Comments 1. DEN. 6

2. grinding on back faces concentrated at top of right side, as on front, but less extensive. The ground faces meet at a pointed edge.
3. stone is weathered & worn, so that extent of grinding is or somewhat obscured. This is so especially on edges: most of left side edge is worn away, so it could have been more ground than 55, & poll edge is completely missing.

4. Ellis Davies, 1929, The Prehistoric & Roman remains of Denbighshire, Cardiff, Wm. Lewis Ltd. In Caernarvon Free Library, 1920, 2 axes exhibited, "found at Llwyn Ynn", inc. this one (Fig. 67 A). By process of correct logic, Davies decides that the other one is that referred to in a note in library, which describes an axe from Coed Cochion wood (Llwyn Ynn) (pp 216-3). 'Caerou Cochion, near Ruthin' is on NMW card, presumably communicated by Caernarvon Town Council who gave cells to NMW. This information was clearly not available to Davies, & should perhaps be doubted.
